#### THE IMPORTANCE OF SUMP PUMP MAINTENANCE

Last month, we provided you with sump pump safety tips to help educate you about ways to prevent sump pump overheating, and the risk of fire. In light of a recent house fire in the Halton Region that was believed to have been caused by a faulty sump pump and then quickly spread to the walls of the house.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you again that sump pumps are like any other piece of equipment; they require proper installation and ongoing maintenance.Spring weather = spring thaws, and this is the time of year when sump pumps have to deal with higher volumes of water. Please ensure that:

- 1. You have a submersible sump pump (vs a stem or column style of pump)
- It is set-up correctly, and the area surrounding the sump pump is free from combustibles
  The sump pump pit is clear of debris
- 4. The motor is in an upright position and not tilted to one side
- Test the sump pump to make sure it is operating properly
  If you suspect that your sump pump is not working properly that you obtain an inspection from your local plumbing professional

### **REMINDER: YOUR ADDRESS NEEDS TO BE VISIBLE!**

Is your address easily visible to emergency response teams? Take the time to confirm that ...

- Your street address (house &/or unit #) are posted in a highly visible location. The numbers are visible from the street - and visible to vehicles travelling in both directions along your street
- Long grasses, shrubbery and trees or other debris are not blocking these address numbers - this includes the vertical and horizontal 911 civic address signs that are so common in our areas
  - The numbers are visible at night

Look for contrasting colors to help boost visibility (ie: if your house is a dark color, choose light/white colored numbers, and vice versa if your house is light in color).

Being proactive will help ensure fire, police and medical emergency response teams will be able to find you quickly and efficiently during emergency call-out situations.
