HOME SECURITY CAMERA REGISTRATION PROGRAM LAUNCHED IN COLLINGWOOD/TBM

In April, we advised that some local communities in our area, including Alliston, Hanover, Tiny Township and Nottawasaga, had joined a community-based security video registry/database program called **CAMsafe**. This voluntary network of residential (and some business and commercial) CCTV and security cameras is helping the OPP expedite investigation procedures and solve crime. When a crime is committed, Police can access the registry to search for cameras in the affected area and then are able to reach out directly to the owner of the security camera to ask them if they would be willing to share their video footage. This can significantly reduce investigation time as it can often eliminate having to go door-to-door canvassing for information.

The home security camera registration program is also available in Collingwood and the Town of the Blue Mountains, and the police services in the area are seeking to raise awareness of it and ask the public to join the online database.

In a **news story from Collingwood Today**, Collingwood and Blue Mountain OPP detachment commander Insp. Loris Licharson said "*I think it's a great program. The more tools we can put in the toolbox to try and help our community, we're game for that. It's a great way for the community to support public safety and support us in ensuring it.*"
