HELP KEEP FIRE HYDRANTS CLEAR DURING SNOWY MONTHS



Our municipalities are asking residents to help keep hydrants clear of snow build-up. In case of an emergency, emergency response personnel need to be able to locate and quickly access the fire hydrant without having to spend valuable seconds digging it out of a snowbank.

Residents with hydrants located on or near their property are asked to clear a one metre/three feet space all around the hydrant and ensure a clear path to the street. It's best to do this as soon as possible after a snowfall to ensure that the area doesn't get hard-packed (if it melts and freezes again) which will make the snow much harder to clear as time goes on.

FIRE SAFETY RESOURCE FOR CAREGIVERS OF PEOPLE LIVING WITH ALZHEIMER DISEASE OR RELATED DEMENTIA

Across Canada in January, the <u>Alzheimer Society</u> supports and leads Canada's Alzheimer's Awareness Month. Our colleagues at the Office of the Fire Marshal (OFM) in conjunction with the Alzheimer's Society have prepared a resource guide for caregivers, to help minimize the risk of residential fire and provide a safer environment for those living with Alzheimer disease or related dementia and their families.

Prevent fire before it starts:

- Fires can begin from careless smoking like improperly extinguishing a cigarette. Discourage smoking by removing visible cues like cigarettes, lighters, matches and ashtrays.
- Provide supervision, when possible, in the kitchen. Ensure combustible materials are a safe distance from the stove, unplug small appliances that aren't being used and store them out of sight and ensure that microwave ovens are being used appropriately.
- Heating appliances like space heaters should be placed one metre/three feet away from anything that can burn. And ensure that there are metal fire screens around woodstoves and fireplaces to help prevent burns.
- Candles should be removed from the home of the person with Alzheimer disease or related dementia to reduce the risk of a candle-related fire.
- Adjust the temperature of water heaters to 54C (130F) to help prevent scalds and injury.
- Install smoke alarms one on every level of the home. Every home in Ontario must

- have a working smoke alarm on every storey and outside all sleeping areas. Homeowners: must install and maintain smoke alarms on every storey of their home and outside sleeping areas. And test them monthly.
- Scan the home for tripping hazards inside and outside and remove any obstacles. Use nightlights to illuminate dark hallways.
- Advise a trusted neighbour that someone with Alzheimer disease is living next-door –
 this buddy system will provide caregivers with an extra set of caring eyes and someone
 who may be able to assist in an emergency.
