**REMINDER: TIME CHANGE MEANS IT'S TIME TO CHANGE
THE BATTERIES IN YOUR SMOKE DETECTOR**

****This information is for those whose smoke detectors**

are NOT tied to an alarm system.**

As a reminder to our customers and colleagues on Sunday, November 6th when the clocks go back an hour, please remember to change the batteries in your smoke detectors. We recommend that you test smoke detectors monthly and change the batteries routinely in the spring and fall when clocks are changed. Replacing smoke detectors over 10 years old should also be done as they have reached their useful lives.

We've come across an impactful infographic to show why properly placed smoke alarms are so vital for early detection of fire. *"Smoke from a housefire is extremely toxic and as fire increases the oxygen in the air decreases."* Early detection means that there is more breathable air around you, which allows you to make better decisions when it comes to escaping the fire. As time goes on, lower levels of oxygen make it more difficult to escape the fire. Judgement becomes impaired and physical symptoms including dizziness, reduced ability to breathe and feeling sick also make reacting more difficult.



Smoke alarms should be installed on every level of your residence and outside all sleeping areas. It is recommended by the Office of the Fire Marshal that for added protection,

smoke alarms should also be installed in all bedrooms. Smoke alarms should also be purchased from reputable retailers who sell UL listed and CSA approved products. They should also be tested monthly to ensure that they are in good working order.
