MEDIA RELEASE: FOR CUSTOMERS IN HUNTSVILLE AND LAKE OF BAYS

We are passing on the following news release, from the Township of Lake of Bays, to our customers in the Huntsville/Lake of Bays region. This door-to-door fire safety campaign to ensure residences have working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms will be conducted by the Huntsville/Lake of Bays Fire Department, in neighbourhoods between 6pm and 8pm.

"During the months of September and October, the Huntsville/Lake of Bays Fire Department will be conducting a door-to-door campaign in neighbourhoods across Huntsville and Lake of Bays between 6pm and 8pm.

Every home in Ontario is required to have working smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms and the fire department wants to spread that message to all our residents.

Firefighters will be going door-to-door providing information on alarm installation, alarm maintenance and home fire escape planning. Firefighters will also be available to check residences to ensure they have the required number of smoke and CO alarms and that they are in working order if requested. The owners of residences that are not in compliance with the Fire Code requirements will be asked to purchase and install additional smoke or CO alarms and/or batteries. Alarms and installation will be available for our senior residents as well as those with financial difficulties or mobility issues.

"Of all the home fires in Ontario, over 50% of the homes did not have working smoke alarms on every level and outside all sleeping areas," said Fire Chief Rob Collins. "We know that working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms save lives and we will do whatever is necessary to make sure everyone is adequately protected."

"The Huntsville/Lake of Bays Fire Department will work with homeowners to make sure they have the correct number of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms for their home and that they are all working," continued Fire Chief Collins.

"That next knock at your door may just save your life."

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK: October 3-9, 2021



We are proud to team up with our colleagues at the [National Fire Prevention Association \(NFPA\)](#) and Fire Departments across Canada and the US to promote this year's [Fire Prevention Week](#) campaign - "Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety!" This campaign works to educate adults and children about the different sounds that smoke and carbon monoxide alarms make. The NFPA states: *"knowing what to do when an alarm sounds will help to keep your family, home and community safe. When an alarm makes noises – whether it's a beeping sound or a chirping sound – you must take action."*



The NFPA has the following tips to help you and your family understand the sounds of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms ...

SMOKE ALARMS – 120 Volt Electrical (Building Code)

- A continuous set of three loud beeps—beep, beep, beep—means smoke or fire. Get out, call 9-1-1, and stay out.
- A single "chirp" every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be changed.
- All smoke alarms must be replaced after 10 years.
- Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.

CARBON MONOXIDE (CO) ALARMS - 120 Volt Electrical (Building Code)

- A continuous set of four loud beeps—beep, beep, beep, beep—means carbon monoxide is present in your home. Go outside, call 9-1-1 and stay out.
- A single chirp every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be replaced.
- CO alarms also have “end of life” sounds that vary by manufacturer. This means it's time to get a new CO alarm.
- Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.

Individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing may not be able to rely on traditional alarms to alert them to fire and carbon monoxide. There are special alarms and devices that may be more appropriate – they include: devices with strobe lights, pillow and bed shakers and low-frequency sound smoke and CO alarms.

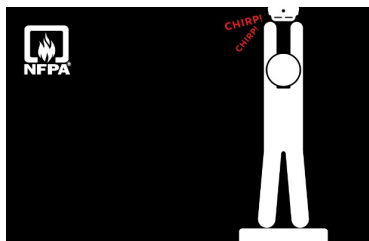

Remember these two phrases ...

If you “**Hear a Beep, Get On Your Feet!**” – get outside and call 911.

If you “**Hear a Chirp, Make a Change!**” – a chirping sound means that an alarm needs attention. It is recommended that you replace the batteries, or replace the entire unit if it is over ten years old.
